**Rationale**

Electronic Government (or e-Government) has been seen by researchers, practitioners and government officers as an approach to improving efficiency and quality of government services. Its practical value and strategic leverage has been demonstrated in many municipalities, regions and countries. However, no clear evidence shows there is a definite correlation between investment in e-Government and benefits perceived by citizens and governments; and little guarantee can be given to success of an e-Government project. There is a demand for theoretical framework and methods for analysis, design and implementation of e-Government systems

This workshop invites researchers and practitioners to share their views, ideas and experience in e-Government. It aims to provide a platform for attendees to establish an understanding of the current state of affairs; theoretical frameworks, methods and technologies adopted and available; challenges and future issues. The workshop will particularly encourage papers concerning the integration of organisational, business and technological aspects, and testing and developing theory and methods within e-Government, though other topics will be welcome. Contributions can be short and full papers, addressing research and practical investigation; exploring novel methods and presenting tested results; business focused and technology oriented. Contributions will come from refereed papers and invited speakers, particularly from government and industry. Apart from publication in the conference proceedings, selected papers will appear in a special issue on e-Government in a journal.
